

During the Academic Year 2016 - 2017 schools with 17 or more pupils received a bulk grant of £8,000 plus £5 per pupil funding specifically for PE development across the whole school. At Belbroughton Primary we strive to utilize this funding to ensure all children receive high quality PE provision within the curriculum, have increased opportunities to experience and participate in a wide range of sports and sporting events within the school and also, in partnership with our Pyramid schools, aim to maximise the number of children that are able to take part in competitive sports events against other schools.

Our key aims and objectives are outlined below ;

- To broaden the range of sports and activities offered.
- To increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff through the use of specialist coaches working alongside teachers and thus develop high quality provision across the full range of the PE Curriculum
- Increase opportunities for participation in competitive sports against other schools.

The table below outlines how the funding has been utilised to support these aims. The biggest proportion of spending is currently allocated to transport and staff costs, to ensure the school teams have the fullest opportunity to perform against different schools at the highest level available.

## Curriculum Development

Throughout the year the PE Coordinator has monitored teaching and resources to ensure staff are provided with the opportunities for additional CPD to further enhance their teaching skills and have access to quality equipment to support the range of different sports offered. In addition, after school clubs have been offered to the children in Athletics, Football, Golf, Tag Rugby and Rounders

## Future targets

The school will continue to focus on providing high quality PE teaching across the curriculum and different age groups and always look for opportunities to extend the sport's experience for children of all abilities. From September 2017 the ring fenced funding for PE is to be increased and it is intended to use a significant proportion of this money to buy-in to the Wyre Forest Sports partnership for the next 3 years. This will widen the number of opportunities for the children to participate in competitive events as well as try new sports and in addition, will provide a more extensive pool of specialist coaching and teaching resources to support staff. In addition, it is planned to undertake a major audit of the school's resources and it is anticipated there will be a substantial spend on renewing and replacing essential equipment.
